

Memorandum. of an agreement made
on the first day of July A.D. 1852. Between J. H.
Mann of Madams Grove Stephenson County and
State of Illinois Party of the first Part. and J. P.
Mann of Madams Grove Stephenson County State of
Illinois Party of the Second Part. To. Wit.

That the aforesaid J. H. Mann was to travel
through the Eastern and Southern portion of the
United States for the purpose of Selling his
Patent Right in a Reaping and Mowing Machine.
And that the aforesaid J. P. Mann was to
Travel with Him and aid in Selling as aforesaid
and pay his own Individual Expenses. For and in
consideration of Ten per Cent of all the Sales
that were actually made during the Journey.

Now this is to certify that the Journey lasted
for a period of about Five Months and during
that Time Sales of the aforesaid Patent Right
was made as follows to. wit.

first The Patent Right for the State of New York was
sold to Wood and Parsons of Horsick Falls. for and in
consideration of One Thousand Dollars to be paid down
and the further sum of Two Thousand Dollars
to be paid in Machines at Fifty Dollars for Each
Machine, the Machines to be Delivered at Horsick Falls
on the day of A.D. 1853.

Second. The Patent Right for the State of California

was sold to J. S. Thayer of New York for and in consideration of the sum of one Thousand Dollars to be paid down, and the further sum of Five Thousand Dollars to be paid as follows, to wit: One Thousand Dollars for Every Twenty Machines that was sold, untill the Number sold amounts to One Hundred.

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third. The Patent Right for the State of Ohio was sold to Ball and Parsons of Hossick Falls. for and in consideration of Two Thousand Dollars to be paid down and the further Sum of Three Thousand and Dollars to be paid in Machines at Sixty Dollars for Each Machine to be Delivered at Hossick Falls on the day of A.D. 1853

fourth. The Patent Right for the State of Tennessee was sold to J. S. Thayer of New York for and in consideration of Five Hundred Dollars to be Paid on the first day of January A.D. 1853

Sixth. Propositions were made to Mr Whitman of Baltimore whereby He is to pay Six Thousand Dollars for the Patent Right for the States of Maryland and Virginia, payments to be made somewhat in the Shape of a patent fee, which Sale, if accepted by Him, is considered as made

the Second Part is Entitled to ten per cent as
in the Sales made before
