

1 An act supplementary to an "act intituled
2 "an act Concerning judgments and Executions"
3 approved January 17th. 1825-

4 Sec. 1st. Be it enacted by the people of the State of
5 Illinois represented in the General Assembly; That
6 every person being the head of a family and living with
7 it, and whose known occupation for the support and
8 maintenance of his family, is farming. Shall be
9 permitted to retain and enjoy exempt from execution
10 in addition to what he is permitted to retain under
11 enjoying under the 19th section of the act to which
12 this is a supplement. one work-horse. one pair
13 of Geans or harness and one plough. And every
14 person being ~~the~~ a mechanic of any description.
15 and also being the head of a family and living with
16 it and who pursues his trade or mechanical art
17 for the support and maintenance of his family.
18 Shall be permitted to retain and enjoy exempt
19 from execution, in addition to what he is per-
20 mitted to retain and enjoy under the aforesaid
21 19th section, mechanical tools suitable to ^{the} kind
22 of trade or mechanical art he may have and
23 pursue, to the amount of one hundred dollars
and if any Sheriff or other officer shall take or
seize any of the said articles of personal property, he
shall become liable, ~~and~~ in the manner provided
in the said 19th section of the act to which this
is a supplement. Province. That nothing in this
act contained shall be so construed as to exempt
any horse except such as is kept for ordinary farm-
ing purposes - or to exempt from execution the
tools of any mechanic unless he shall pursue his
trade or mechanical art with ordinary diligence
and industry.
