The Treasurer Reported, That he had now in his hands \$460,78 (which sum includes \$211,62 in County orders) - leaving \$249,16 cash in his hands. X

The Collector reported a balance in his hands to this date of \$276,85. X

Aug. 7, 1839. Present - J. Kleine, O. C. Latham, A. Lincoln. Mr. Lincoln was chosen President pro tem.

On motion, Lemuel Higby was appointed Collector for 1839. X

On motion, Resolved that the tax for 1839 shall be twenty-five cents on every hundred dollars of real estate assessed in the town of Springfield; and that the Collector proceed immediately to the collection of said tax. X

On motion, Resolved, That the Clerk of the Board be authorized to pay over to J. Kleine the monies of the corporation in his hands.

On motion, Resolved, That Messrs. Kleine and Latham be a committee to ascertain whether Joel Johnson has removed the nuisances of which complaint has been made, and in case they are removed, to direct the town Constable to return the execution satisfied, - said Johnson paying costs.

July 11, 1839. Present - J. Kleine, O. C. Canedy, O. C. Latham, A. Lincoln.

Mr. Canedy was chosen President pro tem.

Mr. Canedy presented the petition of Mr. Roll for liberty to fence up a portion of a certain street. Laid on the table.

Mr. Canedy and Mr. Lincoln were appointed a Committee to report at the next meeting the proper width of side walks on 4th Street.

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Mr. Roque, who had been employed for that purpose, made a report, fixing the grade of the public square, in part, accompanied with profiles.

July 23, 1839. Present. O. C. Canedy, O. C. Latham, J. Kleine,

Mr. Canedy was chosen president pro tem.

Mr. Kleine offered a Resolution, that the license for the theatre per night, shall be three dollars, commencing with Monday night of last week, which was agreed to.

August 9, 1839. Present. J. Kleine, O. C. Canedy, O. C. Latham and J. Lincoln.

Mr. Lincoln was chosen President pro tem.

On application of J. T. Stuart, B. C. Webster, W. Davis and J. F. Amor;

Resolved, That a stone culvert be made, commencing at the point where the Branch crosses Charles B. Francis, running thence diagonally across Market Street to the north-west corner of J. F. Amor's lot; thence diagonally across 6th Street; provided John T. Stuart, J. F. Amor, Walter Davis, and B. C. Webster, pay to the President and Trustees the sum of three hundred dollars, to be paid in proportion as the work progresses—provided further, that the said individuals pay one half of all the costs exceeding three hundred and fifty dollars which shall be required to complete said work.

On application of James Bell and others.

Resolved, That the Board will cause so much of 5th street as lies between the southern side of S. B. Hills and the northern side of S. M. Furley's store, to be graded and widened—the aforesaid applicants furnishing the means to break the rock necessary for the said work.

On motion, Ordered, That the Engineers of the Rail Road running by this town, be requested to cause a ditch to be opened immediately on the western side
