

An Act making appropriations for the years 1841. and 1842.

Sec 1. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois represented in the general assembly That the sum of Eight thousand dollars be and the same is hereby, appropriated as a contingent fund, to meet the Contingent expenses for the years 1841 and 1842. The said fund shall be subject to the order of the Governor, for the purpose of defraying all such expenses as are unprovided for by the general assembly, or otherwise unprovided for by Law; and a proper statement of which shall be laid before the next general assembly of this State, by the Auditor in his biennial report.

Sec 2. The following sums are hereby appropriated in full, for the salaries of the several officers hereinafter mentioned for the years 1841. and 1842. To-wit -

1. The Governor ~~One~~ ^{Three} thousand dollars.
2. To the Auditor of Public accounts including Clerk hire. Four thousand eight hundred - Dollars.
3. To the State Treasurer, including Clerk hire. Three thousand two hundred dollars.
4. To the Secretary of State, including Clerk hire Three thousand - Dollars. and for making index to Journals of the Senate and House.

7. To the Attorney general
One thousand dollars; and State

three dollars per day. Provided that
no one of the inspectors shall receive
more than One hundred and fifty
dollars per annum
- 9 To the ^{Secretary of} Council of revision, ^{four} ~~three~~ dollars
per day.

Sec 3. 1. There shall be allowed to the
Speaker of the House of Representa-
tives, and the speaker of the Senate

twenty miles travel in coming to, and
returning from the seat of government.
