White, Wilkison Price, Peter Sees, and Benjamin Pitt postmasters on said route, leaving Stroudsburg every Thursday morning at 6 o'clock, A. M., and arriving at East Sterling at 6 o'clock, P. M., of said day. Returning, to leave East Sterling every Friday morning, and arrive at Stroudsburg at six o'clock, P. M. of said day. And your petitioners will ever pray, &c.
