Mr. Dunn, from the Committee of Claims, reported the following bill:

A BILL

For the relief of Daniel Steenrod.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-2 sentatives of the United States of America in Congress 3 assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and 4 he is hereby, authorized and directed to pay, out of any 5 moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to 6 Daniel Steenrod, for extra work on the Cumberland road, 7 as follows, viz: For five hundred and eighty-two and a half rods of cording at two dollars and fifty cents per rod; for repairs of four hundred and thirty-six rods of said road, 10 after it was completed and approved, but before accepted, 11 two dollars per rod; for three hundred and eighty-three 15 feet heavy coping cut stone, and dowelled, at two dollars 13 per foot; and for seven hundred and six feet heavy coping, 14 not dowelled, (including four hundred and fifty-five feet 15 doubled coped wall,) at one dollar and fifty cents per foot.
