Dear Sir

I suffer the Agent
of this Section ^{thoroughly} to call your attention to this
matter. When ever there has been an effort
made to get a Route established the Department
has always tried to do after the existing Route
has been the object dissented thereby destroying
some important connection I would say
you that we do not wish the Route to continue
to Jackson for we have a regular communication
from Paulling to Jackson we only desire to have
the Route established from Paulling to Mobile
via Sealswell direct so as to connect with the
Route from Paulling to Jackson. Your friends at Sealswell
have by letter often urged upon me to write you
to have this Route established believing that the Dept
would be fairly remunerated by this Route
I would suggest that you contend for its establishment
as early as the first day of April next. I am aware

that there has been no sent to the departments
for the Bank and they are able to fulfill their
contract if the departments should refuse to
comply will you do your friends the favour to
ask Congress to establish the Bank desired
It is of no small interest to the ready & busy
men of the entire East to have the Bank established
your attention to this subject will
be remembered by you friends through me
