

## IN SENATE.

1. *Be it Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Georgia, in General Assembly met,* That our Senators and Representatives in Congress, be, and they are hereby requested to use their influence with the proper Department of the United States Government, to have a tri-weekly mail route established between Blairsville, Union county, and Mount Yonah, Habersham county, for the convenience of the citizens west of Blue Ridge.

2. *Resolved,* That the Executive immediately communicate this resolution to our Senators and Representatives in Congress.

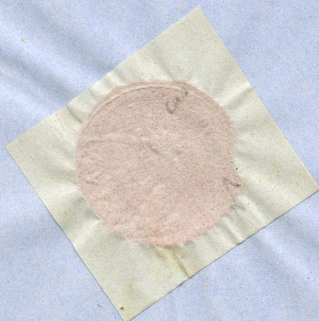
