Mr. FULTON, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, reported the following bill:

A BILL

For the relief of Sarah Hildreth.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-*
2 *sentatives of the United States of America in Congress*
3 *assembled,* That the Secretary of War cause to be placed
4 on the roll of pensioners the name of Mrs. Sarah
5 Hildreth, of the town of Newburgh, county of Orange,
6 and State of New-York, widow of John Hildreth, deceas-
7 ed, who was a soldier of the United States army in the late
8 war with Great Britain, and pay her at the rate of eight
9 dollars per month, during her widowhood, to commence
10 from the first day of December, eighteen hundred and
11 forty-eight—*Seven-*
