Granting lands to certain States therein named to aid them in the construction of roads, canals, and the improvement of their rivers.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-
- ² sentatives of the United States of America in Congress
- 3 assembled, That there be, and is hereby, granted to each
- 4 of the following named States, namely, Michigan, Wis-
- 5 consin, Illinois, Iowa, Missouri, Arkansas, Louisiana,
- 6 Mississippi, Alabama, and Florida, for the purpose of
- 7 aiding said States, respectively, in making roads, canals,
- 8 and in the improvement of the navigation of the rivers
- 9 within their respective limits, a quantity of public land

equal in amount to the several grants made by the Con-10 gress of the United States to the State of Ohio, for like 11 purposes.
