It is in the hope that you are now in Washington that I ~~now~~ write to you and it is my hearts desire that you are now commissioner of G. L. C.

I now write you again for Ryan, to be Register at Palestine, I take the responsibility of saying to you that all of your friends here do wish that you should take place, and as far as I am concerned I do say that I have no

desire that McLean should be appointed. If he is appointed, why I shall have to submit. but I would personally rather see Doct Alexander retained than have McLean appointed. when the proper time arrives I shall go to see you in person or write you in full my views about myself which I do not at present feel at liberty of doing. You have no friend on the Wabash who you can make as large drafts upon as myself and who will never deceive you and I am not certain but what you mistrust
