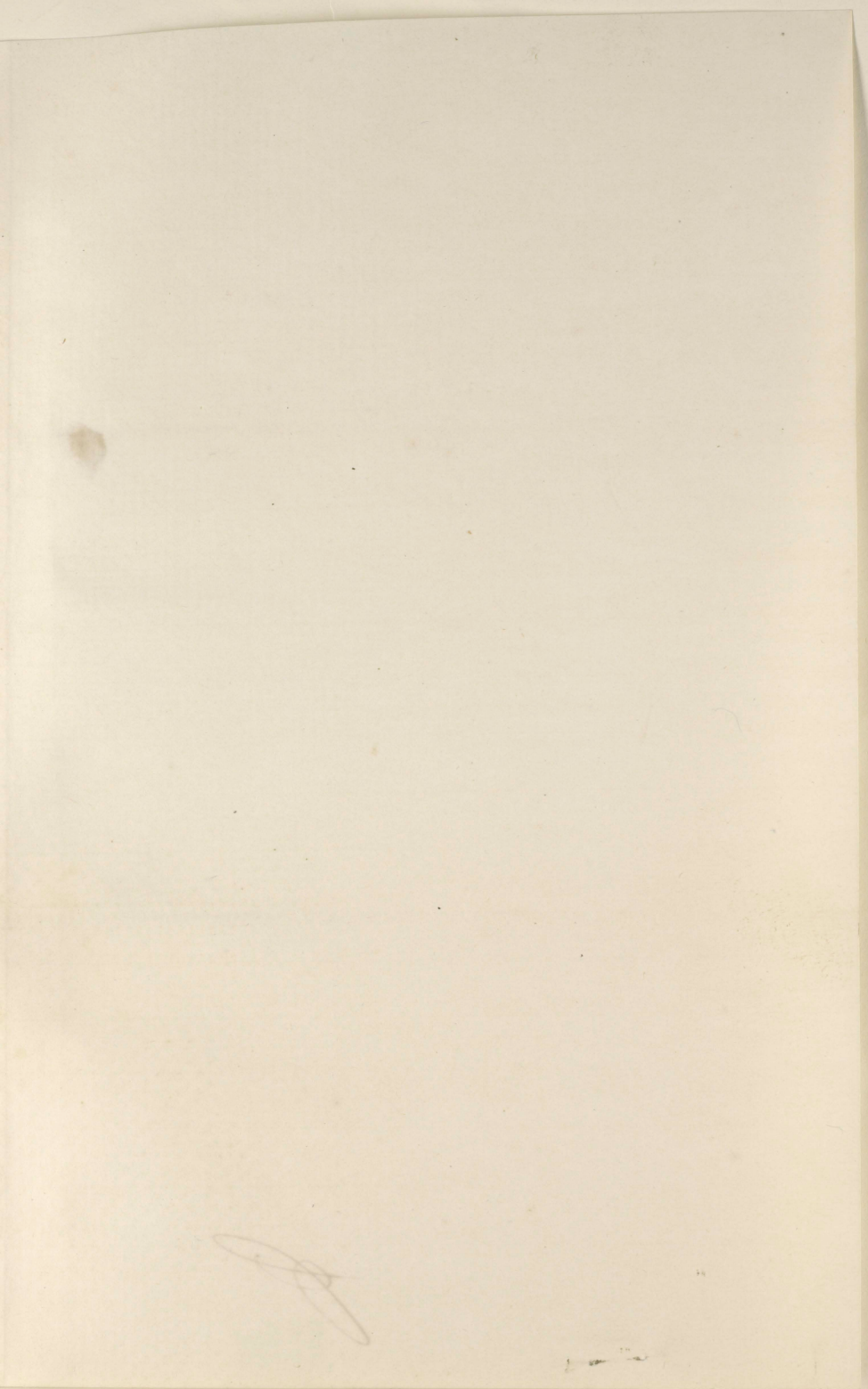
I suppose our Club don't
